The National Literacy Agency would like to inform you that the opening hours of the Literacy Resource Centres have changed.

The Literacy Resource Centre of Malta is open according to the schedule below:

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The opening hours of the Literacy Resource Centre of Gozo are:

From 1 st March - 15 th June	Tuesday and Thursday 14.30-16.30

The Literacy Resource Centres lend literacy resources to all literacy educators (i.e. classroom teachers, LSTs, complimentary teachers, LSEs, KGEs, etc.) and to parents of children who are attending any literacy programme (i.e. complementary service, Reading Recovery, Nwar, Klabb Naħla, etc.).

The literacy centres are located near the National Curriculum Centre, Joseph Abela Sclaro Street, Hamrun and in the primary school of Ta' Sannat, Gozo and they house a selection of resources in Maltese and English brought together to assist those who work in the literacy sector.
